

The County and WCLB worked diligently throughout this process to ensure transparency and promote an outcome beneficial to our community. I commend and appreciate their effort.

Tonight, along with my fellow members of the Trenton City Council, I have reviewed the two final Purchase and Development Agreements. Upon this review, I echo the County and the Treasurer's conclusion that the Agreement reached with CROWN ENT is in the best interest of the people of the Trenton, and I write today to lend my enthusiastic support for this Agreement, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit B, to become reality. The Agreement will ensure an industrial development on the McLouth Steel site that creates jobs, employs local residents, maintains and remediates the property, and pays taxes to the City. Crown Enterprises has further agreed to make philanthropic contributions to the Trenton community as part of the Agreement—and owe damages if its obligations are not met.




